The Mini Car Club of NSW has a proud history of celebrating the history of the Mini in Australia:

significant events have been held over the past 30 years including Minifest '91 in 1991, Minis Down Under in 2001, Minis DownUnder in 2006, Oz50 in 2011 and now – "Minis DownUnder 2021" also hosted by the Mini Car Club of NSW: a celebration of the 60th anniversary of the Mini's manufacture in Sydney and the release of the Australian built Morris 850 in March 1961.

Minis DownUnder 2021 was envisioned to be a Show and Shine for ALL types of minis, Classic and New, to be held in a large indoor area near the centre of Sydney with a capacity to accommodate 100+ Minis undercover plus areas for trade stands. Easy access for regional and interstate participants and spectators and adjacent

parking for trailers and visitors would be required. We wanted good quality food and amenities with close-by accommodation and public transport. The budget would need to permit the Club to recoup most of the costs. After researching and visiting a number of venues around Sydney the preferred location for Minis DownUnder2021 was the Grand Pavilion, Level 1, at Rosehill Gardens Precinct. It has 3300sqm of premium indoor space and met all our criteria.

All Mini car clubs of Australia and NZ were contacted and invited to participate plus a large number of social media posts were made to promote the event amongst the Mini enthusiast community.

A promotional article was included in the UK Mini World magazine and Minis DownUnder was added to their event calendar.

Entrants were slow to register until we got close to the first event date and then a few weeks out we were full with 155 entrants and 8 sponsors agreeing to support our event.

We started with a date for the event of 2nd May 2021; then the pandemic hit we moved to 1 August; we moved to 21st November and finally 6 March 2022 ... not even

















































the 60th year anymore! But we figured if the Olympics could move then so can the mighty Mini.

We sensed a faltering of interest, even in ourselves, caused by lock-downs and Covid itself. We decided to plough on.

But the week before 6 March 2022 heralded some of the worst flooding the east coast of Australia has seen.

Our registered entrants were reporting serious local flooding and Covid outbreaks. We were nervous and coping with streams of phone calls and emails but, we were also encouraged by late interest in participating.

On the day we were slightly down on numbers but managed 140+ Minis and derivatives on show, trade stands representing Canterbury MINI Garage, Shannon's, Mini and Moke World, Mini Works Australia,

E-Valence and SU Midel.

Mini Car Clubs and Mini owners from all over NSW, Qld, Vic, SA and Tas had entered to display their Minis and MINIs in the Grand Pavilion with more parked outside in the "Mini Only Parking" areas. There were certainly some significant Minis on display including a very early 1961 Morris 850 with only 5152 miles since new, 2 x immaculate Monacos, the Broadspeed driven by Brian Foley/Laurie Stewart, (at Bathurst 1967 it was recorded at 127.84 MPH down Conrod Straight). The Cooper S driven by Paddy Hopkirk/Brian Foley at Bathurst 1967, the 1971 Cooper S Class winner at Bathurst in 1974, 25 x Cooper S in a line with a good line up of Clubmans, Vans, Utes and many modified Minis of various heritage.

Spectator admission was open to the general public from 10am to 4pm for a minimal cost with about 1000 people in attendance over the day.







At 2:30pm the Raffles and a Silent Auction were drawn, and we were excited Will Hagon was there to announce the lucky winners and enhance proceedings with some of his Mini adventures.

Approximately \$2500 raised from the raffles and silent auction which will be donated to "Canteen", the charity supporting 12–25-year-olds who are fighting cancer.

We were inspired and delighted by the tenacity of our Mini community in Australia. Valiant little "bricks" had indeed fought their way through the weather to the show from QLD, SA, Vic, Tasmania and NSW. Dave Wallis towed his immaculate Monaco over 1300km from Adelaide and Jono Morris brought the Broadspeed and Paddy Mini also from Adelaide. One entrant drove his Morris 850 from Launceston, Matt Reid had his workshop

in Brisbane flooded and after a quick clean-up he headed south with his Van to display in Minis DownUnder, leaving his crew to continue the clean-up. Heart warmingly we had some veteran Mini race drivers Don Holland, Lakis Manticas and others who shared their stories and enjoyed the Mini ambiance. Our merchandise, with its stand-out MDU2021 logo, sold well and helped to create an event atmosphere

Rosehill Gardens was an excellent venue with superb support for our event. We have received numerous positive comments and most importantly for us reports from people who enjoyed themselves enormously and caught up with old friends: we couldn't ask for anything more.

MCCNSW hosts Mini drives every month and no doubt will be celebrating the 70th anniversary but for now we need a breather.












Ron Moss joined the Nuffield Organisation at Victoria Park in 1954 as Process Planning Engineer. He worked for the company for the next 24 years, holding senior positions as Section Leader, Assistant Manufacturing Engineer (Body), Assistant Planning Engineer (Assembly), Planning Engineer (body), Production Services Manager (Unit Plant), Plant Manager (Sheet Metal and Body Division), Production Manager (Enfield), Plant Manager (Enfield).

Ron introduced many features to the Mini range from the Silver Birch wheels to the removable grille on the Moke. He also designed and introduced the Mini SS, Sunshine, and LS range, as well as the Moke Californian.

This trophy is presented to the owner of the car which Ron has chosen as having best preserved the design character of the Mini/Moke range, on this occasion of the 60th anniversary of the introduction of the Mini in Australia."

My affection for the Mini or more specifically, the Morris Cooper S, began way back in the late 1960's when I was a member of the Army Reserve, then known as the Citizens' Military Force, based at 3 Coy RAASC in Ashfield.

On occasions I would get a lift home on parade night with a fellow reservist who owned a new MK1 Cooper S. The colour scheme was Toga white and Burgundy. I fell in love with that car.

Years later I bought an 850 Mini as a daily driver for my wife. We were both very fond of our Mini but regrettably just had to upsize our car as our family grew.

My first Cooper S came much later. It was a MK2 painted white with a black roof. I carried out numerous cosmetic improvements to the car, including the fitting of original steel wheels and period tyres. I recall taking the car to an All British day at The Kings School one year and meeting for the first time a fellow Club Member, Joe Zulian, who admired my car and expressed an interest in buying it. After some consideration Joe and I agreed on a price and my pride and joy changed hands. I later regretted the decision to sell and so began the search for another Cooper S.

A couple of years later I came across my current S for sale in Lismore. I flew north and sealed the deal. The MK2 was finished in jet red with a white roof and was in overall good condition. Once again I made superficial improvements to the car including a new head lining and door cards. A Tacho was fitted together with new carpets and Minilite wheels.

While the car drove well, some mechanical changes were necessary. A standard camshaft and cylinder head were installed making the car idle smoother and generally run better. A standard exhaust system and an electronic ignition system were also fitted. Here I must thank my close friend Rocky Canto and legendary mini mechanic, Tony Butler, for their help in developing my car to the standard it is today.

I am proud to be the owner of what I think is a very good example of an iconic marque, integral to Australian motoring history.

It is a condition of the scheme that you must be a **CURRENT FINANCIAL** member of the Mini Car Club. If you haven't renewed you must do so ASAP.

Permitted use of the vehicle should need no clarification:

Any activity advertised in the Club magazine, website or Facebook page for vehicles (whether conducted by our club or another club), is deemed legitimate use and is allowed and should be entered on the CLUBS logsheet.

However, use of the vehicle when it is not a prescribed club activity, means the other logbook, (issued by the Transport for NSW, Services NSW) MUST be filled out.

After culling a few people who have not renewed their membership we currently have 223 vehicles on the Mini Car Club Historic and Conditional Plate scheme so it's a pretty busy time.





WHY DON'T WE RUN A MOTORKHANA?

I think it would be a great idea to run another Motorkhana, but before we can get on with organizing such an event maybe it would be a good idea for those who do not know what a Motorkhana is to take a look at what would be needed.

WHAT IS A MOTORKHANA?

A Motorkhana can be defined as an event designed

to test the acceleration, braking and general manoeuvrability of a vehicle and the skill and judgment of the driver. Motorkhanas may be conducted on sealed or unsealed surfaces and require the driver to manoeuvre a car through tight tests as quickly as possible. The description continues to say that a series of flags will be set up in a particular way and the driver must negotiate between the flags via the correct direction – one car at a time. The winner of the event will be the driver who has negotiated between all of the flags in the quickest possible time. These events are the type used by the Club for its Training Days – and children 12years of age and over are permitted to participate.

I hope this has given everyone an idea of what we would be doing at our Motorkhana. Of course, the description is fine, but there is far more to running the event than just knowing what is expected of the drivers and their cars.

We need to start at the beginning!

First, we need a location . . . an area of land that is big enough to set up at least one Motorkhana test – but preferably two. Over many years the Mini Car Club has had grounds around Sydney ideal for running

Motorkhanas – one that comes to mind immediately is a ground at Wilton, where the Club ran its Motorkhana events for many years and became so established in the area that the local Council allowed the Club to erect a steel carport on the land owned by the Council. But ultimately development of the area saw our Club lose those grounds and we were forced to find new grounds elsewhere. There were quite a few areas around Sydney that the Club found it could use for running Motorkhanas after its time at Wilton. Leppington and Greystanes are two areas I remember, plus another ground at Pitt Town that the Club could have purchased had the local residents not fought the Club to the point where the Council would not allow the Club to use the land for the purpose of holding Motorkhanas. Of course, the local residents and the Council probably had no idea what a Motorkhana was! All the local residents could see in their mind was idiot drivers in their V8's careering down their local streets. What a pity those local residents didn't come and watch a Motorkhana, they may have found them beneficial for their own families.

In more recent times the Club has been very fortunate to have the use of a paddock at Riverstone for its Motorkhana events and training days, but as has been the case over the past 60 years finally the developers moved in and we were asked to move out. An ongoing saga!

So now you can understand why we can't run a Motorkhana yet! The Club presently has no grounds it can use.















In the past it was the Motor Sport Competition events within the Club that kept our Club operating financially and gave focus to the art of driving. But if the Club no longer has a ground where it can introduce members to the basics of motorsport, ie: Motorkhanas – where they can learn to drive skilfully then the Mini Car Club of NSW will become a social and mini appreciation club only, and our Annual Competition Trophies a thing of the past.

But, before that happens, you may be able to help!

The ideal area to hold a Motorkhana is a nice flat grassy space where the neighbours are not too close (they don't like noise or dust), and not too many kilometres from Sydney. An acre or two would be ideal.

The Club would hold events on this land on probably six to eight occasions during a 12-month period. The Club would help to maintain the ground, far from being an imposition we would give purpose to the space.

If you, as a member of our Club and are unable to help – then maybe you know someone who might have that area of land that our Club is looking for. WOODEN GEAR KNOBS

Due to the leather slowly breaking down on the original gear knobs for MGR V8s, the fact they are no longer available and during the lock down I had some spare time, I started looking for alternatives. When I found no alternatives available, I decided to make my own by sourcing different Australian timbers and turning the timber into gear knobs to suit.

As the Mini and Mini Clubman original ones are also disintegrating and similarly no longer available, it was an easy solution to also make timber gear knobs to suit. (Attached is a photo of an original Clubman and my Spotted Gum version beside it). After turning and finishing the timber I give them 3 coats of flooring 2 pack clear gloss enamel, then they are polished.

There are many types of beautiful timbers available, so people can ask for various colouring, ie Red Gum, Box Gum, Gidgee, Spotted pine, Tassie Oak and London Plain etc.

Prices start at \$110 each depending on the insert, the timber requested, and the colour tinting which can match a timber steering wheel plus freight. I have a supplier also for all of the gear pattern inserts, depending on the your requirement. I have sold a number to Sydney customers and as far away as Perth and New Zealand with enquiries from the UK.


