














FROM THE HUMBLEST OF BEGINNINGS

I went on to win seven NSW khanacross class championships, two NSW Rallysprint under 2 litre championships, and last year I won the 2-3 litre class in the NSW Hillclimb championships for the second time.... all in FWD cars.

But it all started with a clapped out Morris 850 and this epic Club.

HURTLING TO HARDYS BAY


Sunday 19th November 19 Mini enthusiasts in 12 vehicles met at Thornleigh McDonalds for breakfast before heading off on our journey.







The Australian Mini & Moke 1961 to 1982

Vehicle Registration

June 2023

Over recent times I have read numerous articles on various online forums which relate to problems owners experience in reregistering their vehicles following restoration or problems experienced with the renewal of already registered vehicles. The problems that I have noted are not particular to any one state in Australia.

The most common issue relates to establishing a satisfactory level of identification to please the appropriate government authority at the time of initial reregistration. A second issue relates to multiple vehicles having the same vehicle identification within the respective state data base, in one case an owner was informed that his vehicle carried the same details as another individual's trailer.

While undertaking research over the past I have noticed that the records of numerous vehicles held by the registration authorities are either in error or incomplete for the respective vehicle, the most common issue being the incomplete vehicle identification or the incorrect transposition of the data present on the build plate¹ or compliance plate, depending upon the respective vehicle build date.

These problems can be summarised as follows:

- Use of the Build Prefix only and not including the Car Serial Number, e.g., using YMA2S2 for a Morris Mini Deluxe and not including the associated chassis number.
- Incorrectly reading the Build Prefix, e.g., YMA2S2 in which the letter "S" is misread
 as the numeral "5", the "2S" representing "Two Doors". This problem is very prevalent
 in the Moke range where 018F0B1M10 is misread as 018F0B1M10, i.e., the centre
 character in "FOB" is zero not the letter "O", the zero representing "No Doors".
- Incorrect use of the vehicle model name on the registration paperwork with such descriptions as Morris Mini Saloon Van and, on some occasions the use of the later model RC52 etc applicable to the BMW based Mini.

¹ Build Plates fitted to vehicles for the period to May 1969. Compliance Plates fitted from 1 January 1970. In the period May to December 1969 the Saloon and Performance Saloon identification stamped into the radiator shroud. Commercial vehicles Van & Moke fitted with either Build Plate or Compliance plate for the duration.

My suggestion is therefore that the owner undertake a regimented identification of their respective vehicle to establish the correct and complete data, namely.

- Locate the vehicle Build Plate or Compliance Plate dependent upon Note 1 above.
- Determine the correct data contained upon the plate taking appropriate record such photographs, checking gathered data with that contained in the tables listed below ensuring 100% accuracy of the data.
- Validate the engine number data. Engine numbers are prone to change due to replacement of an engine during the life of the vehicle. Some engines may have their respective number removed during reconditioning and may be replaced by an allocated number by a state Police authority in which case they will take the form "N123456P", a number issued by NSW Police.

FALSE CONFIDENCE

How many people drive around with false confidence?

I remember when I started driving many years ago, I had already been around motorsport for years before I drove for the first time. In a paddock just outside of Mittagong not far from the ghost town of Joadja, I was loaded into the driver's seat of a LJ Holden Torana, aged just 12. This was to be my first driving experience; it was a paddock basher in an open paddock nothing to hit just go for it. I side stepped the clutch at about 4000RPM and off we went; a family friend was sitting next to me so what could go wrong?

I was surprised at how easy it was, even though I could barely reach the pedals, with no driving experience, there was no road to follow or other motorists to worry about, I was suffering from a case of false confidence. So, I decided to pull a handbrake turn, the grass piled up on the outside of the back skidding tyre and the car raised up on one side, luckily settling back down on 4 wheels, that was a bit of a reality check. "Wow that was close" I remember thinking clearly at the time knowing how close we came to rolling it. I wouldn't drive again for another three years apart from tractors and ride on lawn mowers, but this time it was at Amaroo Raceway in my first Super Sprint. That went a lot better as I was more mature and given, I was driving my brother's car it required a lot more restraint and respect.

Fast forward 35 years to now and as a professional driver and trainer I see many people driving on our roads with the same false confidence. But there are levels to this issue, you see some drivers have competency, but they don't understand the risks of their driving behaviour. Or we see driver's that think speeding reduces their time from A to B, only to find themselves rushing up to the next red light and waiting. Yet the light goes green and off they go speeding again.

I was down in Melbourne recently and we witnessed this driver tailgating another motorist in a suburban area with a signposted 70km/h limit, this young guy was less than 3 meters off the back of another motorist trying to push past them. Their vehicle appeared to be modified so you can assume they were an enthusiast, but why would they risk their vehicle for such a trivial purpose? The only explanation is they have false confidence in their ability. This sense that they are a better driver than everyone around them leads them to making poor decisions. Their driving behaviour leads you to only one conclusion, they are nothing but an accident waiting to happen, they don't have some exceptional reaction time, they just have a bit of luck. Or other motorists around them are compensating for their bad driving. Yet their actions indicate a false confidence.

It's a bit like a person with some mechanical knowledge trying to work on their own vehicle, ask any mechanic, they are referred to as "fiddlers" because they invariably waste the mechanics time by needing to fix their mistakes.

I have met many car club members over my time that have had a lot of experience around cars, driving and indeed perhaps racing. Some of these people present as having a higher level of confidence, and perhaps they can spin a quick lap around Wakefield Park or have great car control, but when driving on the road it's a whole other skillset.

There are just too many variables and when it goes wrong there are severe consequences for all. Being in a car club is 100% the best possible pathway for anyone interested in cars, community and perhaps racing. There are so many opportunities to learn, get involved and be part of the passion many people still have for motoring.

But be aware of the false confidence that can come with that terrain when driving on the public road, also as motoring enthusiasts we have an absolute responsibility to conduct ourselves with restraint. Just because you know how to take a corner quick, or recover a slide, doesn't mean you go looking for such scenarios.

It is almost like a professional boxer trying to avoid a fight outside of the ring, they have nothing to prove and everything to lose. So, keep those safe driving conversations going with your family, friends and other club members and when you are on a drive with the club put your best foot forward and drive responsibly. Set the example and that will give you the correct kind of confidence knowing you are being as safe as possible.

Remember that when we have a false confidence in anything we do, we jeopardise our judgement, this is when the worst-case scenario is likely to occur. Save the driving heroics for the racetrack and you will have the right kind of attitude for driving on the road.

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
