CLUB PLATE REGISTRAR'S REPORT

Hi everyone.

Firstly I have to mention the passing of Joan Vaughan.

Not only was she the Club Secretary for a million years, she used to "Mother Hen" and help me in lots of ways, administering the Historic Plate Scheme.

She is sorely missed.

So, another successful year over and done, with our Historic/Classic Plate scheme.

The scheme continues to function well and the numbers have remained stable at around the 250+ vehicles during the year. We currently have 266 vehicles on our scheme, with a mixture of Mini's and Mini variants, other Leyland/BMC family vehicles and a few other makes, and models

Just remember, if you have a vehicle other than a Mini which is eligible, (and you already have a Mini or other Leyland/BMC affiliated vehicle on the scheme) you are able to attain Historic or Classic plates with us. (just contact me or Warwick)

The Club's "Classic" Plate scheme, is for vehicles that don't fall under the "historic" classification so anyone with a car that is too modified to be placed on the Historic scheme, can still take advantage of the benefits of the scheme.

Information is on the MCCNSW website. If you have a vehicle that is not eligible for historic rego, the Classic (modified) scheme may be for you.

We have modified the current CP01 form and deleted the requirement to provide information on insurance for your vehicle. Insuring your pride

and joy is your responsibility, not a MCC requirement. (although we recommend it)

This year, the Mini Car Club Annual Christmas Party will again host the Annual Club Plate Inspection Day. It's on Sunday 14th December, so put it in your diaries. Car owners who bring their Club plated vehicles to be inspected, and those vehicles deemed to be eligible, are issued with a letter allowing them to renew registration without a further Club inspection, that year (however a pink slip is still required).

If your car is inspected at the Annual inspection day, it can save a lot of last-minute running around for you and for our Club Plate examiners. Please come along and boost our numbers.

Please watch out for event announcements on our website and Facebook pages.

Once again, I would like to thank our group of Historic Plate Eligibility Examiners, who graciously and voluntarily carry out the eligibility inspections on behalf of the MCC.

Also, thanks to the "Buttman", Warwick Butt, who as my trusty sidekick carries out my job when I cannot.

Please note that requirements for new and registration renewals are listed on the CP01 form (and CPM01) and hopefully make for less confusion when registering your car.

Thanks to everyone who helped out through the year. Have a great rest of 2024 and 2025, hope to see you all "Mini-ing" around.

TREASURER'S REPORT FOR YEAR ENDED 30TH JUNE 2025

The Club's financial results for the year ended 30th June 2025 show a Loss of -\$4,895 which was an increase on the previous year's Loss of -\$1,450

Members Equity is \$78,710 compared to the previous year's figure of \$89,766.

The Total Income of \$38,281 consisted of mainly; Subscription Fees \$17,154 down from \$20,073 of last year. Note: Club Subscription Fees have not increased for several years. Competition income vastly decreased to \$4,173 from \$16,112 previously, due to only recently gaining use of our own Motorkhana grounds, thanks to the Heydon Family.

Social Income of \$7,009 increased due the Club covering some of the

accommodation Booking expenses prior to Minis on Safari attendees repaying the Club. We wish to thank the Benton's arranging Minis on Safari and for arranging the purchasing and storing of the Club's merchandise, plus the Bradshaw's and volunteers who assisted with selling the Club merchandise.

Total Expenses of \$43,176 consisted mainly of; Merchandise purchases \$6,522 compared to \$4,212 last year. Social Activities cost \$9,750 compared to \$3,331 previously. Short term Competition expenses of \$4,458 are well down on the \$15,035. last year. Magazine printing and postage totalled \$9,191 slightly lower than \$10,183 last year. Magazine printing costs were lower than last year, even with outsourcing the

printing. Magazine postage was reduced due to the culling of non-financial.

A Special "Thank you" goes to the Club Committee, volunteers and delegates to related Associations who willing give their time and efforts and support to the Mini Club.

We continue to gain new Memberships with many BMW MINI owners joining our Club.

This 2025 Financial Report will be posted on our Clubs website and in the Summer edition of the East West magazine.

SOCIAL REPORT

8th September- Phil Briggs Run, our annual run was to The Pickled Wombat at St Albans for lunch. Ian and Tami Thompson led a convoy of 30 Mini Club members and friends with 19 cars including 16 Minis via

Wisemans Ferry Road to St Albans

15th September – All British Day the 41st All British Day, was held at a new location, Hawkesbury Showground, Clarendon. This event is our Club's annual show and shine and in 2024 there were 59 cars on display and 75+ Club members in attendance.

19-20 October - Bathurst/Kandos weekend. Joe Zulian and Ian Thompson led this event of 21 Mini enthusiasts who set off from Richmond to drive up the Bells Line of Road to Bell and then turn off to Mt Victoria. Morning tea at Oberon. MINI CAR CLUB OF NSW (MCCNSW) COMMITTEE

The MCCNSW was formed in 1962 as the Morris 850 Car Association of NSW and in 1964 the 1100 Association was incorporated into the 850 Association Structure. By 1972 there were three 'labels': Mini Car Club, Morris 850 Car Association and Morris Mini Car Association of NSW (source: '21 years' p.88). From 1976 the title "Mini Car Club of NSW" was adopted, having scrapped "Morris" and "Association".

The early years of the Club were mostly focused on motorkhanas and rallies with a strong belief in nurturing respect for driving skill and of course the Mini itself. In more recent times the Club's activities still reflect a strong respect for driving skill and the Mini but motorsport has declined in light of the aging of the classic Mini and many of the owners, the facilities available and increased vehicle running costs. Nevertheless the founders would be delighted to know that MCCNSW remains one of the largest car clubs in Australia, with over 700 members, and continues those early values of respect for driving and the glorious Mini in all its iterations, including MINI.

The Club has to be structured, organized and led to fulfil its obligations to Government requirements. These include reporting, recording and financial management. Importantly it also has to meet the requirements of its members, whether they be motorsport insurance, motorsport validation, historic car registration, recording of activity, social interaction, opportunity to learn and see good, and bad, examples of car restoration. In 2023 the Constitution was revised in line with the latest government requirements.

The Committee, which has to be renewed annually, has a responsibility to manage the Club on behalf of and in the best interests of its members (source: Motorsport Australia Club resource guide). It meets monthly, just before the general members' meeting, to address its obligations and plan for events large and small. Despite the official sounding agenda in fact the Committee offers opportunities to socially interact and contribute to the well-being and longevity of the Club.

For 2025/26 some members will nominate to continue, some may not and new blood is always welcome.

Here follows a list of the roles of Committee members and their duties. Be assured the Committee works as a team and support one another in each of the roles.

COMMITTEE MEMBERS:

President *This role is elected* and leads the Club by presiding over meetings, setting goals, evaluating, monitoring, motivating, solving problems, recruiting and training Committee members, and representing the Club

Secretary *This role is elected* and is very important in terms of recording, filing, detailing, coordinating, scheduling meetings, handling correspondence, communicating with Motorsport Australia, following up on actions decided; keeping minutes.

Treasurer *This role is elected* and prepares budgets, plans and monitors finances, records and reports on revenue and expenditure, ensures financial compliance, shows evidence of finance and banking and related activity including PayPal and online platforms, produces an audited annual financial report, does not allow expenditure to exceed assets.

Club Captain (Meetings Vice President), Competition Secretary*, Competition Department (3)* *These five (5) roles are elected.* They prepare competition programs for ramification by the Committee, they oversee the scheduling, planning and conducting of all motorsport activity, they coordinate staff for those activities, they manage Club motorsport equipment, they evaluate and report on activity to the Committee and are familiar with Motorsport Australia regulations

Social Secretary & Assistant Social Secretary *These two (2) roles are elected.* They ensure a social event calendar is established reflecting the desires of members; ensure those activities are conducted; ensure members are aware of the activities, budget for activities in association with the Treasurer

Registrar *This role is elected.* They monitor, collate and report on points earned by Members engaged in motorsport or social activity which count towards Club awards.

Magazine Editor *This role is elected.* They select articles and generate ideas for articles and features, they seek articles from relevant contributors and provide editing as required; they compile the quarterly magazine using design software and ensure it is ready for printing on time.

Promotions Officer* *This role is elected.* They oversee the implementation of a marketing plan and promote the Club. This may involve marketing social or motorsport activity, sourcing speakers for Club meetings, acquiring products or sponsorship for Club activities and ensuring the Club secures opportunities for exposure, participation or other benefit.

Merchandise Officer *This role is elected.* They ensure the Club is adequately stocked with suitable merchandise, reflecting the core values, image and interests of the Club; they provide opportunities for members to acquire items whether that be direct purchase or online; they manage acquisition and storage



and audit the stock; they report to Committee, particularly the Treasure on revenue and expenditure.

Webmaster *This role is elected.* They ensure the homepage is truthful and not liable to legal challenge on matters of copyright, ensure privacy of members' details, update homepage, update Club's calendar, remove and /or archive material, report to Committee, download items of interest to the Committee. They also manage the Club's social media presence, including Facebook, Instagram and "X" previously Twitter and advise Committee on those sites.

Historic Plate Registrar. *This role is elected.* The Club is approved by the Transport for NSW' to be part of the Historic Vehicle Registration Scheme. This means cars 30 years or older can be registered and insured with substantial savings by financial Members of the MCCNSW. This role manages our policies, our obligations and our procedures relating to the scheme. They report to the Committee on Members' participation and compliance and advise Members on those matters. They also advise the Assistant Historic Plate Registrar and the Club Plate Examiners

Meetings & Catering Department. *This role is elected.* They arrange for raffles with prizes to be held at general meetings and other events and ensure catering is organized as required for motorsport.

Club Representative to Motorsport Australia; Club Representative to Council of Motor Club, In; Club Representative to the Association of British Car Clubs. *These three (3) roles are elected.* They attend the meetings held by the respective groups and advise the Committee on matters discussed.
